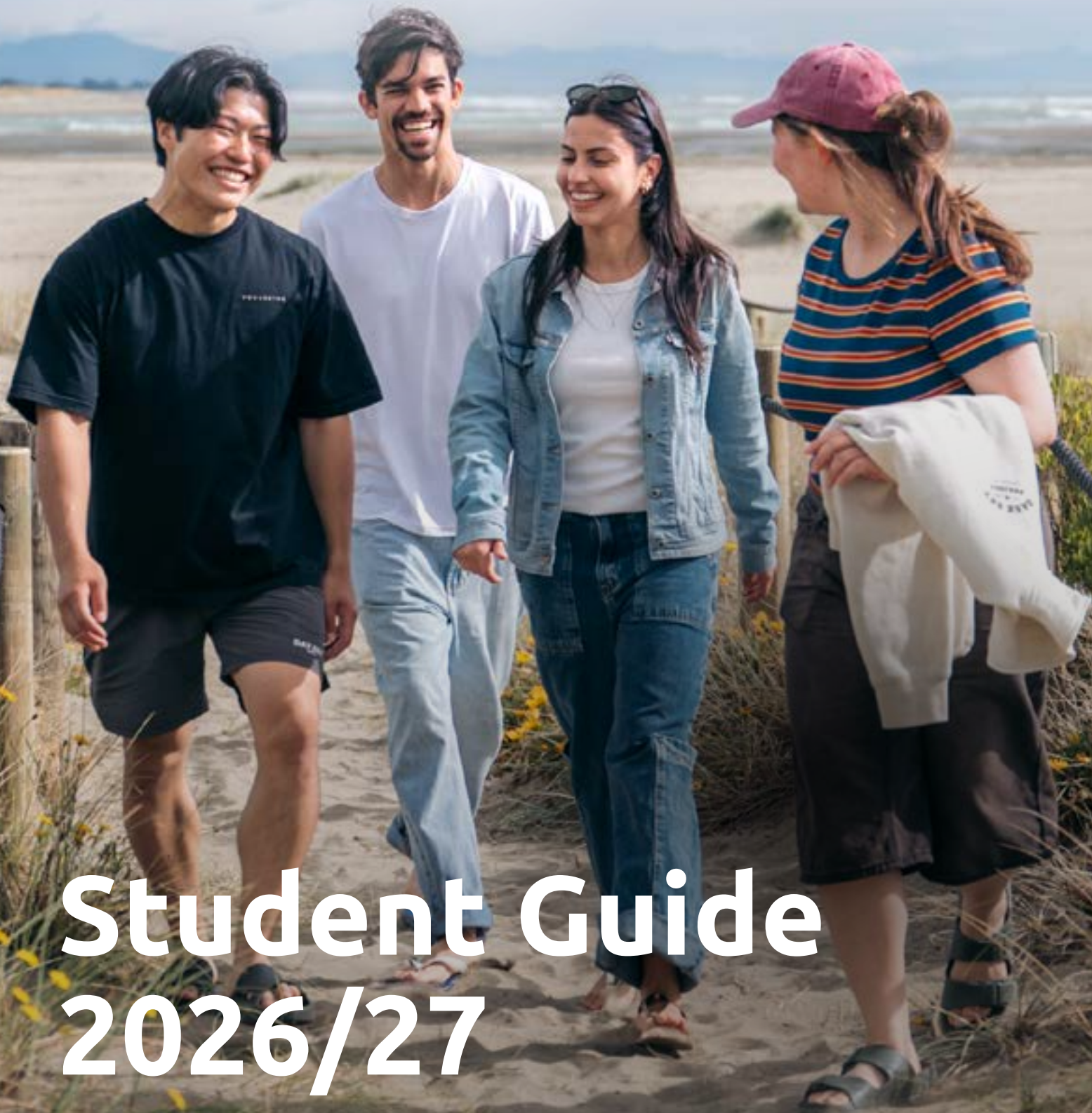

Campus

CCEL is located on the University of Canterbury (UC) campus. At CCEL you can enjoy a university environment and the use of UC facilities. With expansive green spaces and gardens, the natural beauty makes it a great place to learn and relax.

SPORTS AND FITNESS

The Rec Centre is the main fitness facility on campus. Membership allows CCEL students to use the gym for a range of activities: cardio and weight training, disc golf, wall climbing, yoga, squash, and other court based sports.

CCEL CAMPUS

CCEL is purpose-built for English language learning and classes are small in size (18 students per class maximum). There are 20 classrooms, a well-resourced self-study centre, use of technology in classrooms, and students get free internet and WiFi access.

CHRISTCHURCH ACTIVITIES PROGRAMME

Christchurch, like the rest of New Zealand, has beautiful scenery, wonderful cultural activities and many adventure sports on offer. There are so many things to see and do in Christchurch, and CCEL's activities programme is the perfect way for students to have fun while improving their English.

Activities change every week, are optional, and include: Conversation Club, job search workshops, cooking classes, sport, and cultural visits. At the weekends students can choose experiences like surfing, ski trips and tourism options like whale watching.

Accommodation

All CCEL student accommodation is carefully selected and monitored by CCEL staff. CCEL can arrange for students to live in a homestay with a New Zealand family or with other students in a student residence.

HOMESTAY

Living with a CCEL homestay is perfect for students who want to experience the New Zealand lifestyle and get extra support.

Choosing to live with a host family provides students with:

- their own room with a desk for studying
- breakfast and dinner every day plus lunch at the weekend and on public holidays
- a sense of community from day 1
- the ability to practise English with their host family every day.

UNIVERSITY STUDENT RESIDENCE

The university student residence is for students who want to share an apartment with other students in Christchurch.

Living in the university residence will provide:

- a single room with a desk for studying
- shared living facilities with up to 5 other students
- kitchen facilities for meal preparation
- life on the university campus, within walking distance of CCEL.

CCEL is the official English language provider for the University of Canterbury (UC) and UC International College (UCIC). The New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) has rated CCEL as having the highest level of academic quality and student support.

CCEL courses include General English, Exam Preparation, High School Preparation and English for Academic Purposes.

Group Programmes (study tours) provide a powerful option for groups of students to travel and study together, and develop life-long friendships.

Courses

GENERAL ENGLISH

General English courses are for people who want to improve their all-round English skills and learn how to communicate effectively.

COURSE OVERVIEW

- Improving speaking, listening, reading, and writing abilities. Using grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation for effective communication.
- Gaining confidence in communicating with English users from different cultures.
- Building a solid foundation of skills for further study and/or life-long learning of English.
- Receiving regular feedback on progress.

PLACEMENT AND ASSESSMENT

- Day 1 placement test.
- Regular assessment of speaking, listening, reading and writing skills.
- Ongoing monitoring of progress and academic counselling.

EXAM PREPARATION

Students can prepare for internationally recognised Academic English exams, such as IELTS, at CCEL.

COURSE OVERVIEW

- Learning about test structure and task types through regular practice.
- Studying strategies to maximise results.
- Learning how to avoid common errors that can impact test results.
- Focus areas include:
 - Listening: previewing and predicting, listening for specific information;
 - Reading: speed reading strategies;
 - Skimming and scanning;
 - Speaking: expressing ideas and opinions;
 - Seeking clarification and pronunciation;
 - Writing: interpreting questions, planning;
 - Organising and reviewing content.

ASSESSMENT

Listening, reading, writing and speaking skills are assessed through practice tests.

HIGH SCHOOL PREPARATION

Our High School Preparation Programme is designed to help students prepare for high school study in New Zealand.

COURSE OVERVIEW

- Developing speaking, listening, reading, and writing abilities.
- Learning key language for a range of subject areas: Mathematics, Science, History and Literature.
- Developing independent and cooperative research skills to complete projects.
- Building confidence in presentation skills.

ASSESSMENT

- Listening, reading, writing and speaking skills are assessed through in-class tests.
- Participating in class tasks, individual and group, and completing assigned set tasks.

As the official English language provider for the University of Canterbury (UC) and UC International College (UCIC), students who successfully complete an EAP course and meet the academic entry requirement can transfer to their chosen tertiary programme.

EAP 1 (ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES)

COURSE OVERVIEW

- Developing academic speaking, listening, reading, writing and critical thinking skills.
- Gaining confidence in presentation delivery, developing skills for taking exams and improving exam outcomes.
- Learning about and using referencing skills and participating in tutorial type settings.

- Focusing on development of higher level academic skills: speaking, listening, reading, writing and critical thinking skills. In-depth evaluation of academic texts.
- Delivering extended researched academic presentations.
- Learning about and using referencing skills and participating in tutorial type settings.

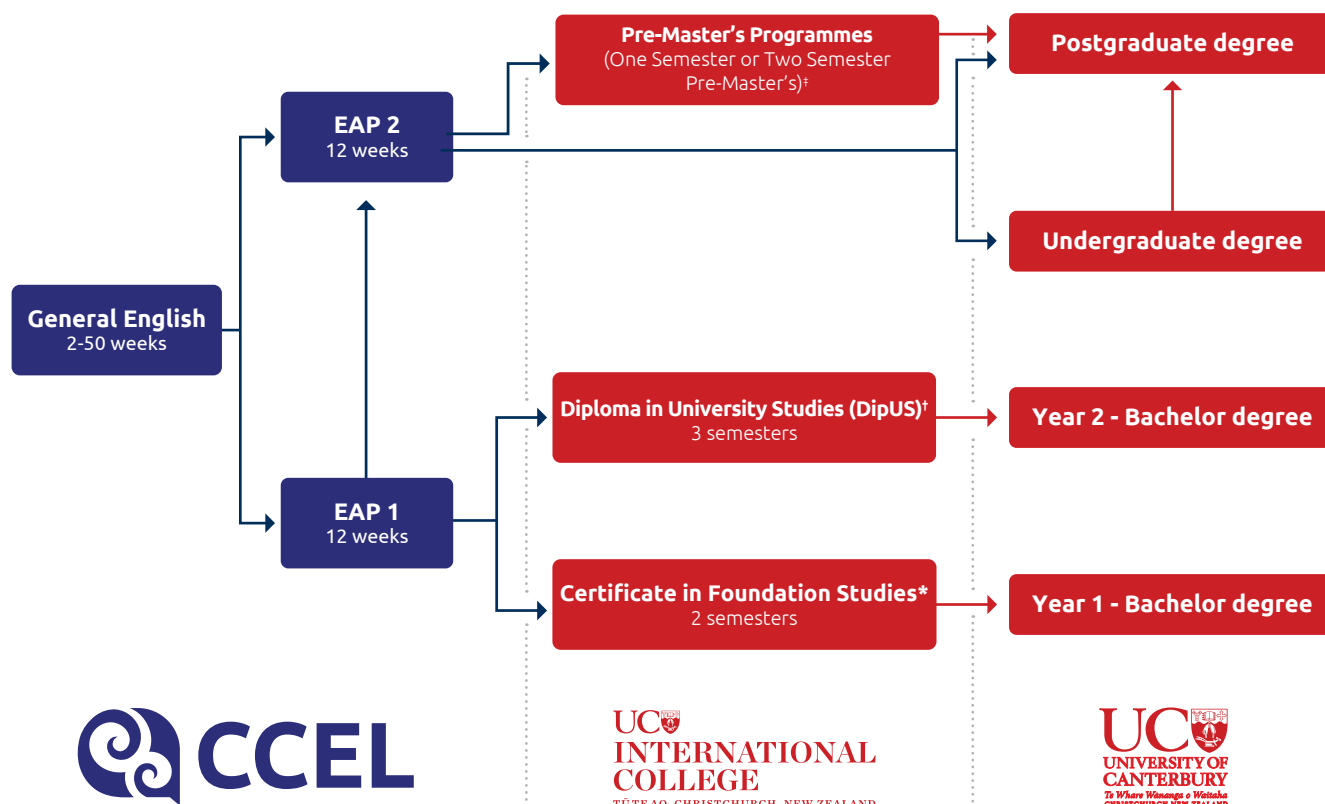


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PATHWAY COURSE PROGRESSION CHART

UC International College



UC International College (UCIC) is CCEL's sister college. UCIC offers a direct pathway for international students who wish to study a Bachelor's degree at the University of Canterbury. UCIC is located right on the beautiful UC campus and offers students a truly embedded experience at their future university. UCIC students have access to the world-class facilities and services that the UC campus has to offer.

PROGRAMMES AT UCIC

DIPLOMA IN UNIVERSITY STUDIES (DIPUS)

DipUS is equivalent to the first year of the relevant bachelor degree at the University. It allows students to transition from high school and complete their bachelor degree in the same amount of time as students admitted directly to UC.

DipUS is designed to give students extra academic and language support in the important first year of tertiary study. Students will study the equivalent of eight academic courses (120 credits) over 12 months and pathway directly into Year 2 at UC.

CERTIFICATE IN FOUNDATION STUDIES

Certificate in Foundation Studies is designed to help bridge the gap between high school and university entrance. Delivered in a nurturing and supportive environment, students will study eight courses to prepare them for their chosen degree at the University of Canterbury.

PRE-MASTER'S PROGRAMME

The pre-master's programme offers a pathway into postgraduate study for international students who don't meet prior study requirements, increasing access to Master's degree programmes in Business, Engineering, Science, Health, Education and Arts.

The pathway comprises one semester of study that prepares students generally for postgraduate study and one semester of study that builds relevant subject-specific knowledge.



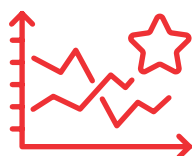

STEP 1: ENROL WITH CCEL

CCEL works with education agencies all over the world. They can help students choose the best course and can also help with visa applications and travel arrangements. Please contact us to check the location of your nearest agencies. It is also possible to enrol directly with CCEL. When we receive your enrolment application, we'll send you an Offer of Place and invoice for course fees.



STEP 2: MAKE PAYMENT

Payment of the course fees invoice can be made via online banking, one of the student payment services available or credit card.

STEP 3: ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

PATHWAY VISA WITH UC INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE AND THE UNIVERSITY OF CANTERBURY

Students who are studying English at CCEL and are interested in continuing their studies at UC International College and then the University of Canterbury, may be eligible for a Pathway Visa. A Pathway Visa allows you to apply for a single visa to cover your study period from English language to the end of your programme at the University of Canterbury. This is a great way to reduce the time and cost involved in visa applications.

CONDITIONS OF ENROLMENT

MEDICAL AND TRAVEL INSURANCE

International students (including group students) must have appropriate and current medical and travel insurance while studying in New Zealand.



GRIEVANCE AND COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE

CCEL is open to feedback and is committed to solving problems and resolving grievances in good faith.

CCEL will:

- give students a voice,
- work towards finding out where a problem exists,
- work towards a fair solution.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE

The Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC) provides accident insurance for all New Zealand citizens, residents, and temporary visitors to New Zealand, but you may still be liable for all other medical and related costs. Further information can be viewed on the ACC website at www.acc.co.nz



ELIGIBILITY FOR HEALTH SERVICES

Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. They may be liable for the full costs of any treatment required, if not adequately covered by appropriate medical and travel insurance.



ATTENDANCE

Your attendance is monitored and recorded on a daily basis to ensure that your visa requirements are met.



IMMIGRATION

HOLIDAYS
